The following KIDS video explores the 7 sensory systems, or pathways through which information is input to the brain.

- Sense of Vision
- Sense of Hearing
- Sense of Touch
- Sense of Smell and Taste
- Sense of Body Awareness
- Sense of Movement and Balance

The 7 systems do not work in isolation; each overlaps and hopefully integrates with the others, although each has a specific role in providing a person with their sense of self. Watch this video to find out more about the sensory systems and how differences can affect children and young people.
